Notice to Cyclists

Due to the notice on the post outside the Croft bungalows being no longer visible the residents would like to remind you of the following:

PLEASE DO NOT CYCLE ON THE PATH OUTSIDE THE CROFT BUNGALOWS AS THIS IS FOR PEDESTRIANS ONLY AND YOU COULD BE FINED.

85(1) of the Local Government Act 1888), cyclists must not cycle on a footway (pavement) and must keep to the cyclists' side of a segregated cycle track. The maximum penalty for cycling on the pavement is a £500 fine however, in most cases, the police will issue a Fixed Penalty Notice (On-the-Spot Fine) of £50.

Tostock Memories

My name is Barry Smith and I used to live at Fox & Goose cottages until 1955 when I, aged 17, left home to join the Royal Navy. Until then I used to sing in the Church choir with Colin Moore, His parents kept the Gardeners arms, Ian Davidson,

I believe he emigrated to South Africa, John Hazelwood (Known to us youngsters as "Nutty") and Christopher Buxton. This was when Miss Mash played the old foot pumped organ. The vicar then was the Rev Lilley, he also covered Drinkstone, where we had to cycle to for our confirmation classes

This will probably come as a surprise to you as I live in West Cornwall now (since 1963). I am sitting here playing around with my laptop and saw the "Tostock Chronicle". I got quite excited! I saw that you are Parish Priest and though I would contact you with memories of my childhood. In the 80s my father, Ted Smith, was a Church warden at St Andrews.

In the afternoons we boys would call into Mr. Murton's shop, which was set back off the Lays Road. It was just his front room really. We used to buy 5 Players weights (cigarettes') each !! and a packet of chewing gum,(to clean our mouth's out before we got home)! We would walk to Drinkstone blue waters then around the village "Chatting" up the girls.

I'm 85 next birthday and now that I have found the "Tostock Chronicle" website I will keep an eye on it'.

COUNTRYLIFE - D. POOLE NUMBER 45

Last year at this time, because of the Covid Pandemic and for those people that couldn't get out and about, you may recall that I brought you all an article on Sheringham Park back to Tostock. So I thought I would do the same thing again this year. The Pandemic is still with us and something we will all have to live with, along with the high rising fuel prices, plus the cost of living going up and our living standards dropping, and to make matters even worse Vlademir Putin's invasion of Ukraine and the devastation he has caused to the Ukrainian people. We are all in a desperate state of affairs and in need of a good "pick me up" tonic. So I hope this will lift our spirits – on Saturday 19th March 2022 Penny and myself decided to go to the Thriplow Daffodil Weekend. We had been on a couple of occasions before, and what a good day it was. The weather was fine, and its also been an exceptionally good year for daffodils in general and Thriplow got their timings spot on – the daffodils were magnificent. Thriplow is a small village in the south of Cambridgeshire, just 3 miles from Duxford Airfield on the A505 and is very similar in many ways to Tostock, the layout, size and population and the properties are as picturesque. It has opened its doors now for well over 50 years, to many hundreds of visitors, as far afield as Wales and the New Forest. From a very small beginning, organised to raise money for the repairs to the church, to an extensive Country Fair, involving nearly the whole village, it has provided an enjoyable day out for many hundreds of visitors and raised many thousands of pounds for local and national good causes. The endeavours of the close-knit community of Thriplow can all feel mighty proud of themselves for their achievements and it is well worth a visit.







The 1st daffodil weekend took place in April 1969, organised by parochial church council and church wardens and the weekend has run ever since. In 2011 the Queen's Golden Jubilee award for voluntary service was awarded to the committee to celebrate the hard work put in by the village over many years in making the weekends so successful. Which is now displayed for all to see mounted on the front of the village hall balcony. There is also a framed certificate signed by the Queen on the side of the balcony.

On 16th and 17th March 2018 the village celebrated its 50th Golden Daffodil Weekend. Why daffodils – early in 1966 it was the attractive yellow blaze of daffodils in the Thriplow gardens admired by the church wardens from St George's Church tower that gave them the idea of a Spring daffodil festival to raise monies for the church (called the church restoration fund) hence the first daffodil weekend got started in April 1969.

Daffodils everlasting, the weekend has been even further woven into the history of the village with daffodils found in everlasting bloom in three sites - the village green, the church and the new church extension. On the green is the village sign made by Harry Carter and erected in 1978 with four entwining painted daffodils down each side, replaced in 2000 by his grandson with ten daffodils five down each side. In St George's Church, three daffodils appear in the stained-glass window by artist Ann Southeran, donated in the 2000's by the Thriplow Society in commemoration of the 2nd millennium.

A further three daffodils appear in the new toilet extension entrance on the engraved glass window, 2015 by Sally Scott and given by John Keatley. They are also found on the some of the church kneelers that were made and embroidered by villagers with funding from the Daffodil Weekend, so, this is the place of the modest daffodil in the history of Thriplow Daffodil Weekend that has in its planted bulbs, the village sign and the church, becoming bedded in the body, the heart and soul of the small Cambridgeshire village with its great community spirit and charity fundraising over the last 50 years. Or as echoed by the villages of Thriplow, Wordsworth's so elegant finish in his 1907 Daffodil poem

"And then my heart with pleasure fills and dances with the daffodils"

Part of the planning in order to celebrate their 50th anniversary weekend was to search and find a new variety of daffodil to be named Thriplow Gold, with enough bulbs to provide a central village display.

On the face of it, this seemed to be a tall order considering the bulbs needs planting by autumn 2015 - 2016 latest and producing a new hybrid in quantity takes over 20 years. This request was passed to the gardening club who in turn contacted Ron Scamp, a leading British expert daffodil bulb producer in Cornwall October 2012 continued

Remarkably, it seemed at such short notice, he could supply this special flower having a small number of new unnamed, unregistered varieties fully developed in quantity available for sale by 2014-2015. Ron Scamp had by then registered over 400 new hybrids and had under cultivation some 2,700 bulb varieties at his Falmouth farm, one of the largest U.K. collections. In 2015, 500 new Thriplow Gold daffodil bulbs were purchased by The Weekend Committee and 200 the following year.

How this 50 year celebratory daffodil was developed is a story of botanical, genetic and culture intrigue together with patience and long-term investment. Thriplow Gold started 1983 when Ron Scamp crosspollinated N.ORMEAU with pollen from another flower (unnamed seedling then) resulting from a previous cross of N.ST KEVERNE with N.ARTIC GOLD. It is not uncommon in the very competitive international breeding world to delay registering and naming new hybrids until the bulbs were ready in quantity for show and sale. The ripe seeds, few in number were collected in Spring, sown in September and germinated to new bulbs. These took on average 6 years to bloom, with this then unnamed "seedling-cross" flowering in 1989. The resulting flower was considered successful with the new hybrid having certain unique features, the cross not registered previously and the bulbs were then re-planted. As the subsequent flowers remained true and identically with healthy plants, then the bulb numbers were increased by natural budding of 1-3 new bulbs, being then dug up and re-planted everyone 1-2 years. The 500 Thriplow Gold bulbs purchased in 2015 had taken over 20 years to develop. The new hybrids named Thriplow Gold and details were finally logged with RHS International Classification Register in 2016. It was admirably described by Ron Scamp as a strong sturdy traditional flower, bold in colour and disease hardy. It is mid-season flowering, standard height as 1 YY being in division 1, having yellow trumpet and yellow petals as shown above Over the years the Weekend has attracted many other attractions – such as Morris Men dancing at various venues over the Weekend bringing a touch of music and colour, as do the bands that come and play. For many years the music was provided by a band called Thriplow music which was made up from many musicians of all ages and expertise from the village. The school children give demonstrations of Maypole dancing and there are often demonstrations of sheep dogs rounding up ducks and geese. Volunteers drive mini-buses to take the more elderly around to the various attractions. There are also rides on drays pulled by heavy shire horses which are always a great attraction. In 2017 the Civil War Re-enactment Group (the Sealed Knot) came and gave a taste of what it must have been like in Thriplow during the Civil War during the 17th century. There is a lot of provision of teas and homemade cakes to the thousands of the visitors. Punch and Judy and face painting are amongst some of the entertainment for the children. Vintage cars on display. At the church which had started the whole idea off has always been very much involved, giving organ recitals, the bells are rung, old church documents are on display and the church always beautifully decorated for the Weekend. Some of the people open their gardens to the public, there are charity stalls as well as craft stalls, and odd car boot sales. The friendly ferrets are an attraction along with "on the ball" gun dog scurry and dog show, also miniature steam engines, and a large steam engine, tractor and trailer rides. The ever popular Raptor Association is always a big hit. continued

In 1992 The Thriplow Society was formed to preserve the history of the parish and surrounding area. The parish council, who owned the Smithy which is a working Blacksmiths forge asked the society to look after the building which was then opened every daffodil weekend with the working forge and an exhibition of village history mounted in the shed. The Smithy is popular especially when it is windy or raining as the warmth and glow of the fire draws many people in to see such an old craft being demonstrated. As well as a Blacksmith working the forge and making horse shoes, pokers, iron daffodils as souvenirs etc. The exhibition usually has a theme, subjects have been landscape and wildlife, farming between the wars, transport through time, Church and Chapel, old houses in Thriplow etc. The village sign stands next to the Smithy. The Tithe barn now a grade 2 listed building holds demonstrations such as wool spinning on a Spinning wheel, or sheep shearing have been some of the attractions. The local pub called The Green Man - these days providing refreshments and a beer tent, in the past have had the Morris Men performing and sometimes a bbq. In 1991 The Green Man was closed owing to the death of the publican, and the windows were boarded up, as daffodil weekend approached, Shirley Wittering and her daughter Polly thought the blank boards looked most unfriendly, so they painted daffodils along the lower boards to cheer up the visitors. 2012 the pub was bought by the village and is once again the centre of good food, good beer and an asset to the village as well as to the daffodil weekends. It's always fun and educational visiting other villages functions, as well as our own here in Tostock and that surely must be what country life is all about - long may it reign. Thriplow is a fantastic day out for the whole family.







Thriplow Daffodil Weekend conclusion

It's very sad when someone passes away in our village, even more so when it happens to be your neighbour particularly because I was talking to him just a few weeks before, it comes as a great shock. Our sincere condolences and sympathy to Maureen. Derek was a very intelligent electrical engineer and, on several occasions, repaired and got back working items for both Penny and myself, saving us a small fortune in the process. He served on the Parish Council and was a member of TOADS and very proud to do so, he always kept up a very high standard for us all to follow and will be sorely missed by us all. This is my own personal tribute to Derek.


